Signature: Aviator sunglasses, worn leather flight jacket

#### Beyer:

**Age:** 60s, Large, grizzly bear-like build; bushy salt-and-pepper beard; hairy chest; usually shirtless or in ragged shorts. A retired astrophysicist with a big intellect and bigger personality

Think: Sebastian Cabot, Theodore Bikel or Peter Ustinov

#### Neil O'Malley:

**Age:** 60s, Clean-cut, professional airline captain look, Irish-Australian heritage, friendly but urgent demeanor **Think:** Liam Neeson with a tan and pilot uniform


